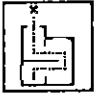

Emergency Plan

Escape Plan

(activity on reverse)

In a fire or other emergency, you may need to evacuate your home on a moment's notice. You should be ready to get out fast.

Develop an escape plan by drawing a floor plan of your home. Show the location of doors, windows, stairways, and large furniture. Indicate the location of emergency supplies (Disaster Supplies Kit), fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, collapsible ladders, first aid kits, and utility shut-off points. Next, use a colored pen to draw a broken line charting at least two escape routes from each room. Finally, mark a place outside of the building where members of your household should meet.

Be sure to include important points outside such as garages, patios, stairways, elevators, driveways and porches. If your home has more than two floors, use an additional sheet of paper.

Make sure to practice your escape plan each time you set your clocks for daylight savings time.
